Learning at Braddan School

- √ Talk to your child about what they are learning —
 your interest means a lot
- ✓ Encourage your child to 'have a go', especially when they are uncertain. Praise and reward the effort your child makes as much as you would performance or results
- ✓ Encourage your child to keep improving; let your child make mistakes so that they can learn from them
- √ Encourage your child to ask questions
- ✓ When your child gets stuck, don't give him / her the answer; instead, encourage them to try different ways to become 'unstuck'.

Science, History, Geography

Art, Drama, Design Technology and Music



During these DT sessions, children will be planning, making and reviewing their work. Literacy

We will be working on forms of punctuation and reminding ourselves of what needs to be included in our writing. We will be writing letters, newspaper articles and stories about Robin Hood.

We are going to continue to focusing on our reading this half term, having lots of time to read in school and encouraging children to read daily at home.



Mathematics

We will be continuing our work on:

- Adding and subtracting number in 1s, 10s, 100s and adding and subtracting 2 digit and 3 digit numbers
- Multiplication of 2, 5 and 10s
- Learning to multiply and divide by 3 and 4 and beginning sour 8 times table.
