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Mathematics

This term in Mathematics, both Year 2 and Year 3 will be exploring fractions and time. Year 2 will focus on recognising and using fractions such as halves, thirds, quarters, and wholes through practical and visual activities. Year 3 will build on this by learning to compare and order fractions, as well as adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator. Later in the term, both year groups will move on to telling the time, with an emphasis on reading both analogue and digital clocks accurately. Your continued support at home in practising these skills is greatly appreciated.

Literacy

In Literacy, the children have been learning how to structure their writing using paragraphs and are continuing to develop their understanding of punctuation. They are practising how to organise their ideas clearly; use capital letters; full stops; question marks and exclamation marks accurately. As we move forward, the children will begin to apply all of these important components in their own writing, creating longer and more detailed pieces that show their growing confidence as writers.

Topic

This week, we will continue to learn about our class butterflies, observing the final stages of their life cycle. The children have really enjoyed watching them grow and change, and we're excited to release them into the wild later this week. Following this, we will be moving on to explore other animals in nature, focusing on wildlife and the different habitats animals live in. This will help the children develop a deeper understanding of the natural world around them and the importance of caring for living things.

Science

In Science this term, our Year 2 and Year 3 students have been exploring a range of engaging and hands-on topics. Year 2 children are learning about wildlife and life cycles, with a special focus on butterflies, bulbs, and seeds. They are developing their observation skills as they investigate how plants grow and change. Meanwhile, Year 3 students are delving into the fascinating world of forces and magnets, discovering how objects move and interact. They are also studying plant growth in more detail and learning about the importance of biodiversity in our natural environment. These topics help the children build curiosity about the world around them and encourage thoughtful scientific investigation.

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
